


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PUBLIC SAFETY RIBBON CUTTING



While we've been apart, our staff has been working hard to prepare to welcome everyone back. We are currently only opened during the weekends for Timed Ticketing. We are allowing 50 guests per 1 1/2 hour time slots and advice you reserve a time online or by giving us a call (308)698-2228.

We have implemented new policies and procedures to ensure a safe visit for families. Those measures include cleaning and sanitizing the entire museum from top to bottom after every time slot. Sanitation Stations have been added that include hand sanitizer, disinfectant spray and cloths to wipe down toys at your convenience.

We are implementing plyscial distancing measures with one family per exhibit and encouraging visitors to bring their own face masks and wear them if they are ten-years-old and older.

Why is the museum vital to our community?

There are so many places kids go where they are expected to sit still and stay quiet. And that's okay sometimes! But having a place where kids can move around, get loud, and let their imaginations run wild is so essential! Every day, we bring kids to a lot of "our" places (stores, businesses, etc.), but this is THEIR place. Kids need their own place.

We have visited other children's museums in different cities, and they've all been very fun, but I hope our community realizes what an absolute gem we have right here in Kearney.

What do children learn at the museum?

We have been to the museum numerous times, and they learn something new every single time!

Sometimes they learn through their observation of the different zones, like intently watching the trains. Sometimes it's through their interaction in the zones, like sending the boats down through the streams of water they designed. Sometimes it's when we read the information from each zone, like discovering where our food comes from. And sometimes they learn through our prompting and example, like taking turns, cleaning up when we are done, and treating each zone with respect.

I love that many of the zones represent "real life" places, like the grocery store, bank, dentist office, etc.

It can be hard to teach my children while we are running errands, for example in a real grocery store, because it can often be chaotic. But in the museum, we get to focus on the fun and the learning. We can talk about food groups and nutrition, I can explain to them how hard the grocery store employees work and how important they are, and my kids can learn by interacting. They're having so much fun, they don't even realize they are learning!

How does the museum help your family?

We love having the museum as a fun, safe place where we can let the kids just be kids! As my kids have gotten older, it's been fun to see the new ways they can interact with the zones they have always loved and the zones that are designed for their older age group.
