FUTURE CONCEPT "PLATTE RIVER WATER TABLE"

This exhibit will display the Rocky Mountains as Nebraska's water source. The table will include raining clouds, hydroelectric dams, irrigation pivots, Sandhill Cranes, and the Platte River. Users will be able to view the entire table and visualize the flow of water ways. Guests will be able to manipulate the water flow and see its impact on the rest of the environment.
